Considering the high percentage of individuals with disabilities who are victims of crimes in our state and in our nation, how do you intend to address the equal access problems in victims' services and in the justice system that currently exist in Delaware?

### **Question 2**

Mental illness and drug abuse treatment services are severely under-funded in this state. What would you do to improve the Delaware Psychiatric Center and community programs for persons with mental illness and/or drug abuse?

### **Question 3**

If there are plans to develop a larger public transportation system in the state that would increase public access, thus enabling persons with disabilities to have transportation to jobs, healthcare and other personal needs services, how will you, as Governor, help make it a reality?

### **Question 4**

Healthcare, preventative screenings, fitness, health promotion and dental services for adults, are not readily accessible to persons with disabilities. How will you, as Governor, address these barriers that result in poorer health status for Delawareans with disabilities?

### **Question 5**

Most public housing is not available to people with disabilities. Housing that may be available is not affordable to people who are on SSI or otherwise very limited income. People with mental illnesses, including addictions, make up half the homeless in the state of Delaware. What would you do to promote more affordable, accessible and integrated housing throughout the state?

### **Question 6**

Inclusion is an issue in Delaware. Inclusion involves both access to programs and activities and support for participation in the programs and activities. Inclusion needs to start at birth and be central to all systems across the life span. How would you work with schools, child care providers and other community resources to welcome and include children with disabilities, building an inclusive continuum going forward?
